





CALVARY CEMETERY Established in 1921 - 160 Acres

Calvary Cemetery opened in 1921 and is the largest of the Catholic Cemeteries. Calvary is home to the Catholic Cemeteries office. A statue of Rachel mourning silently sits in the center of the Holy Innocents section for infants of all faiths.




Archbishops Floresh and McDonough are buried at Calvary in the section for Diocesan priests. The Sisters of Mercy, Resurrectionist Priests and Xaverian Brothers also have lots here.






Various sized lots, community mausoleums and columbariums, two committal chapels and family mausoleums transform the valleys and hills into a city of stone and art. Approximately 50,000 people have been laid to rest at Calvary.





ST. LOUIS CEMETERY Established in 1867 - 43 Acres

The first St. Louis Cemetery opened for services in 1811 and was located behind the original St. Louis Church at 10th and Main Streets. When St. Louis Church was relocated in 1831, the grave sites were moved to the Catholic section of Western Cemetery. The grave sites were later moved to the present St. Louis Cemetery which was opened in 1867.



St. Louis Cemetery was known as the "Irish" Catholic cemetery, but Catholics from many different heritages have been laid to rest here. Diocesan priests, Xaverian Brothers and Little Sisters of the Poor have lots in St. Louis Cemetery.







Over a mile of limestone wall surrounds the property. Close to 50,000 burials have taken place at St. Louis Cemetery.

ST. MICHAEL CEMETERY Established in 1851 - 48 Acres


